Pick a Commitment:

- 1. Provide a project or responsibilities for an intern for **6 hours per week** OR
- 2. Allow an intern to shadow you for **3 hours per week**

Interns are trained on:

- Microsoft suite (Word, Excel, PPT, and Outlook)
- Communications (marketing materials, phones, and outreach)
- Research

The goal of the HCSA internship program is to serve **25 high school students** for an opportunity to gain experience in non-clinical/administrative health careers within the Health Care Services Agency.

The mentorship dates are March 9, 2020-May 31, 2020. Details attached.

How it works:

- 1. Attend a 90-minute Preceptor Orientation (By Appointment Via Zoom or In person)
- 2. Attend the Intern-Preceptor Match Day (**Feb 19**th **3:30-5:00PM**) *Preceptor must be present and/or find a representative from your team (3:30-5:00PM)
- 3. Guide 1-2 high school students in completing a project/work of your choice for 6-8 hours per week

Who: Preceptors are either staff of any HCSA department (Admin/BHCS/PHD/EH) and/or HCSA subcontractor or community partner

Why:

- 1. Receive entry-level assistance from our trained college preparatory students
- 2. Complete a project to assist your work and/or your units efforts
- 3. Build to build up a successful, thriving health workforce!
