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


BACKGROUND

In 2014, The Atlantic Philanthropies awarded \$21 million in grant funds to the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD), Alameda County Health Care Services Agency (HCSA), and Alameda Health System to support and expand health career pathways in Oakland. The agencies formed the Oakland Health Pathways Partnership to promote cross-systems integration with the goal of strengthening OUSD health pathways and increasing the number and quality of healthcare internships and other work-based learning (WBL) experiences for OUSD students.

Today, HCSA continues to support high school age youth through the Career Exploration Program funded

by the City of Oakland's Oakland Fund for Children and Youth. Over the next 3-years, HCSA will provide up **200 high school students** work experience within one of HCSA's four departments. 20 ethnically diverse youth per summer, fall, and spring will be provided a PAID-internship that includes county professional development training facilitated by Human Resources and then interns are matched with a HCSA professional or team to complete a project or work assigned by staff.



The goal of the HCSA Career Exploration Program is to provide high school students with what they need to obtain a viable career in the health sector. HCSA is committed to breaking down these barriers for ethnically diverse student populations. In our experience, the impact of internships for students of color builds confidence and encourages the students to be dedicated to reaching their full potential and thrive in their communities. *Explore our Videos*.

The Healthcare Agency Pathway Partnership for Youth

Leadership and staff of many departments within HCSA came together to develop an internal collective impact framework. The group is known as the Healthcare Agency Pathway Partnership for Youth (HAPPY) Committee. The main focus was to allow professionals from different departments and divisions to identify a common agenda to increase diversity in the Alameda County health workforce. The top priority was to expose ethnically diverse youth to career opportunities within HCSA and its partners through an internship, the HCSA Career Exploration Program.

- 1. Exposure to Non-clinical health careers and public service
- 2. Delivers knowledge of social determinants of health to build awareness of health disparities

- 4. Trainings on civic engagement, job search, CPR and triage, mental health first aid, etc.
- 5. Support the growth and development of leadership and professional skills
