Description: In this training, participants will review the historical roots of stigma in Black communities and learn strategies and tools to reframe mental health, connect black communities to care, and reimagine healing and wellness within a healing justice framework.



Over the last decade, **Yolo Akili Robinson** has worked in the public health field as a counselor, curriculum developer, facilitator, and a trainer. In 2016, Robinson launched BEAM (The Black Emotional and Mental Health Collective), a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization with the mission of eliminating ethnic, racial, and socioeconomic disparities in access to mental healthcare.

By the end of this training, participants will have increased their capacity to:

- Name and identify common symptomology and framing of mental health challenges in Black communities.
- Challenge and provide accurate information on common myths on medication, psychology and mental health in Black communities.
- Apply a healing justice framework to their approach to mental health in Black communities.
