## Course Objectives

1.) Assess supervisees' level of stress and vicarious traumatization (VT) to determine which kinds of interventions are needed to address the impact of stress and VT.

2.) Determine 2 types of interventions to address time management and work prioritization difficulties for staff.

3.) Obtain 3 skills to teach to staff how to effectively and ethically provide Telehealth services.

4.) Utilize at least 3 different interventions to address challenging behaviors in supervisees in behavioral health care.

At the end of this course, participants will be able to assess their current supervisees to determine how the unique stresses of these times are negatively impacting their work with clients and overall functioning.
