Description: Participants will learn how tobacco-use impacts the health and survival outcomes of people living with an HIV/AIDS diagnosis. Anti-viral medications have greatly prolonged the life expectancy of people diagnosed with HIV/AIDS, however tobacco use health effects continues to be the leading cause of death among this group, making it imperative to support cessation efforts for this population.

Who Should Attend: Clinical staff who provide services for clients in HIV/AIDS treatment programs

Learning Objectives - at the end of the training, participants will be able to:

1. Name at least two (2) facts about how tobacco-use harms people living with HIV/AIDS
2. Name at least two (2) treatment options and/or services that can help support special populations with tobacco treatment
3. Demonstrate two (2) Motivational Interviewing strategies to help create dialogue with patients who are ambivalent about quitting tobacco in role-plays during the training
4. Demonstrate how to create a quit plan with a client/patient over the course of a 15-20 minute one-on-one counseling session in role-plays during the training
