## Trauma-Informed Standards, Practices and Strategies for Healthcare Organizations: Safety Talk in the Context of CLAS and Cultural Competency



Gabriella Grant is the director of the California Center of Excellence for Trauma Informed Care. overseeing the Center's research, program, and professional development as well as policy analysis. Her background includes heading the nation's first community corrections-based victim advocacy program and running a threeyear project funded by the California Department of Public Health to increase access to domestic violence shelters by women with mental health and/or substance abuse issues. She earned her undergraduate degree from Amherst College, a Latin teaching certificate from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, Italy and a Master's in Public Policy from Johns Hopkins University.

**Description:** This two-hour training introduces participants to "Safety Talk" as it relates to practices of a trauma informed and culturally responsive ACEs framework for behavioral health providers. It will cover the standards of trauma-informed practice, as delineated by the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) and the National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN). Special attention will be paid to the delivery of services with National CLAS Standard, Principal 1: "Provide effective, equitable, understandable, and respectful quality care and services that are responsive to diverse cultural health beliefs and practices, preferred languages, health literacy, and other communication needs." All participants must complete the pre-reading prior to the webinar. The link to the pre-reading will be located in your registration confirmation.

**Educational Goals:** Attendees will learn to practice compassionate, present-focused, culturally competent questioning about safety and its impact on health. The concept of "safety talk" will be explored to improve effective patient referrals to resources to increase current safety and reduce actual risks in the patient's life.

## **Learning Objectives:**

- Identify 2 ways to not blame consumers for protective responses.
- Describe one specific SAHMSA principle for connecting community trauma exposure/effects to the service or populations (gender, racial, cultural, etc.) being served.
- Specify 2 actions that an individual/agency will take to expand the voice and choice of consumers in treatment planning.
