IF YOU DO NOT AGREE WITH THE DECISION MADE FOR YOUR MENTAL HEALTH OR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER TREATMENT, YOU CAN FILE AN APPEAL. THIS APPEAL IS FILED WITH YOUR PLAN.

HOW TO FILE AN APPEAL

You have **60 days** from the date of this “Notice of Adverse Benefit Determination” letter to file an appeal. **If you are currently getting treatment and you want to keep getting treatment, you must ask for an appeal within 10 days** from the date on this letter OR before the date your Plan says services will stop. You must say that you want to keep getting treatment when you file the appeal.

You can file an appeal by phone or in writing. If you file an appeal by phone, you must follow up with a written signed appeal. The Plan will provide you with free assistance if you need help.

Your provider will have appeal forms available. Consumer Assistance can also send a form to you.

You may file an appeal yourself. Or, you can have someone like a relative, friend, advocate, provider, or attorney file the appeal for you. This person is called an “authorized representative.” You can send in any type of information you want your Plan to review. Your appeal will be reviewed by a different provider than the person who made the first decision.

Your Plan has 30 days to give you an answer. At that time, you will get a “Notice of Appeal Resolution” letter. This letter will tell you what the Plan has decided. **If you do not get a letter with the Plan’s decision within 30 days, you can ask for a “State Hearing” and a judge will review your case.** Please read the section below for instructions on how to ask for a State Hearing.

EXPEDITED APPEALS

If you think waiting 30 days will hurt your health, you might be able to get an answer within 72 hours. When filing your appeal, say why waiting will hurt your health. Make sure you ask for an “**expedited appeal.**”

STATE HEARING

If you filed an appeal and received a “Notice of Appeal Resolution” letter telling you that your Plan will still not provide the services, or **you never received a letter telling you of the decision and it has been past 30 days**, you can ask for a “State Hearing” and a judge will review your case. You will not have to pay for a State Hearing.

You must ask for a State Hearing within **120 days** from the date of the “Notice of Appeal Resolution” letter. You can ask for a State Hearing by phone, electronically, or in writing:

Be sure to include your name, address, telephone number, Date of Birth, and the reason you want a State Hearing. If someone is helping you ask for a State Hearing, add their name, address, and telephone number to the form or letter. If you need an interpreter, tell us what language you speak. You will not have to pay for an interpreter. We will get you one.

After you ask for a State Hearing, it could take up to 90 days to decide your case and send you an answer. If you think waiting that long will hurt your health, you might be able to get an answer within 3 working days. You may want to ask your provider or Plan to write a letter for you, or you can write one yourself. The letter must explain in detail how waiting for up to 90 days for your case to be decided will seriously harm your life,

your health, or your ability to attain, maintain, or regain maximum function. Then, ask for an **“expedited hearing”** and provide the letter with your request for a hearing.

Authorized Representative

You may speak at the State Hearing yourself. Or someone like a relative, friend, advocate, provider, or attorney can speak for you. If you want another person to speak for you, then you must tell the State Hearing office that the person is allowed to speak for you. This person is called an “authorized representative.”

NOTICE OF ADVERSE BENEFIT DETERMINATION (NOABD) TABLE
For Medi-Cal Beneficiaries: Specialty Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services

An Adverse Benefit Determination is defined to mean any of the following actions taken by the Behavioral Health Plan (BHP), which includes Alameda County Behavioral Health (ACBH) and ACBH-contracted providers:

1. The denial or limited authorization of a requested service, including determinations based on the type or level of service, medical necessity, appropriateness, setting, or effectiveness of a covered benefit;
2. The reduction, suspension, or termination of a previously authorized service;
3. The denial, in whole or in part, of payment for a service;
4. The failure to provide services in a timely manner;
5. The failure to act within the required timeframes for standard resolution of grievances and appeals; or
6. The denial of a beneficiary's request to dispute financial liability.

Beneficiaries must receive a written NOABD when the BHP takes any actions described above.

Denials include determinations based on type or level of service, requirements for medical necessity, appropriateness, setting or effectiveness of a covered benefit. The BHP must mail the notice to the beneficiary within two (2) business days of the decision.
Payment Denial Notice	ACBH	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian	ACBH denies, in whole or in part, for any reason, a provider's request for payment for a service that has already been delivered to a beneficiary. ACBH must mail the notice to the beneficiary at the time of any action denying the provider's claim.
Delivery System Notice	ACBH	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian	ACBH has determined that the beneficiary does not meet the criteria to be eligible for specialty mental health services (SMHS). The beneficiary will be referred to the Managed Care Plan, or other appropriate system, for mental health and/or other services. The Plan must mail the notice to the beneficiary within two (2) business days of the decision. NOTE: This template does not apply to SUD services.
Modification Notice	BHP: ACBH and ACBH-contracted providers	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian; ACBH QA	The BHP modifies or limits a provider's request for a service, including reductions in frequency and/or duration of services, and approval of alternative treatments and services. The BHP must mail the notice to the beneficiary within two (2) business days of the decision. Requires provider notification within 24 hours. ¹
Termination Notice	BHP: ACBH and ACBH-contracted providers	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian; ACBH QA	The BHP terminates, reduces or suspends a previously authorized service. The BHP must mail the notice to the beneficiary at least ten (10) days before the date of the action. Requires provider notification within 24 hours. ¹
Authorization Delay Notice	ACBH	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian	When there is a delay in processing a provider's request for authorization of specialty mental health services or substance use disorder residential services. When ACBH extends the timeframes to make an authorization decision, it is a delay in processing a provider's request. This includes extensions granted at the request of the beneficiary or provider, and/or those granted when there is a need for additional information from the beneficiary or provider, when the extension is in the beneficiary's interest. ACBH must mail the notice to the beneficiary within two (2) business days of the decision.
Timely Access Notice	BHP: ACBH and ACBH-contracted providers	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian; ACBH QA	When there is a delay in providing the beneficiary with timely services, as required by the timely access standards applicable to the delayed service. The BHP must mail the notice to the beneficiary within two (2) business days.
Financial Liability Notice	ACBH	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian	ACBH denies a beneficiary's request to dispute financial liability, including cost-sharing and other beneficiary financial liabilities. ACBH must mail the notice to the beneficiary at the time of any action regarding the dispute.
Grievance & Appeal Timely Resolution	BHP: ACBH and ACBH-contracted providers	Beneficiary or parent/legal guardian; ACBH QA	Failure to timely resolve grievances and/or appeals. Use this template when the BHP does not meet required timeframes for the standard resolution of grievances and appeals.

NOTE: The BHP must also communicate the decision to the affected provider within 24 hours of making the decision, initially by telephone or facsimile, and then by writing, except for decisions rendered retrospectively.¹ Services that are reduced, modified, or terminated by outpatient providers that are not subject to prior authorization and are the result of a treatment Team/Clinician decision based on the beneficiary's clinical condition and/or progress in treatment is not subject to an adverse benefit determination notification. The beneficiary still has the right to appeal the decision with the BHP even if a NOABD is not received.
