Dear Provider,

Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services (ACBHCS) would like to thank you for your dedicated service for Alameda County's Medi-Cal beneficiaries.

Under the Affordable Care Act in order to obtain Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS) consumers must demonstrate functional impairments in the moderate-to-severe range due to their mental illness. ACBHCS is taking this opportunity to review and redesign our outpatient managed care program of which you are a contracted provider. Proposed changes include:

- 1. Improve timeliness of the beneficiary's connection to service by expecting all providers to outreach to the prospective client upon receipt of a referral letter from ACCESS.
- 2. Require all outpatient services for consumers be referred through ACCESS.
- 3. Develop a stronger provider network where all providers carry a minimum caseload of five SMHS clients.
- 4. Offer increased rates for our Managed Care Network of Providers.
- 5. Allow claiming for "brokerage services" to assist your clients in connecting with community resources such as primary care physicians, housing resources, and social services.
- 6. Comply with managed care brief therapy guidelines: initial ACCESS referrals include an assessment, 12 therapy services, and 3 brokerage/collateral services in a 6 month timeframe. Limited additional services, if necessary, may be requested through the Authorization Services Unit.

During the Fiscal Year 15/16 we will be introducing these changes and communicating them to you. If you feel this redesign is not suited to your practice, please contact the Network Office at 510-383-2874 to request withdrawal from the Network. Information will also be posted on the Provider Website http://www.acbhcs.org/providers as it becomes available.

Again, thank you for your years of service to our Medi-Cal beneficiaries.
