- Treatment Programs -

- Capacity to accept 3-way calls with portals
 - During regular intake hours
 - Focus on building rapport
 - No additional duplicative screening/assessment
 - Try to arrange intake appointment within 3-days
 - Maintain contact and reminders/engagement as needed



- Opioid Treatment -

- New Procedure Codes for Opioid Detoxification
 - New Opioid Detoxification Codes being added to all Reporting Units (RUs)
 Shorter-term tapering service versus longer-term maintenance
- Closing the Separate Non-DMC Detoxification RUs
 - For programs with Non-DMC funding, these clients may now be served under primary Opioid Treatment RU up to cap specified in Exhibit B
- Renaming of Primary Opioid Treatment RUs
 Move towards more broad RU name
- Coming soon... MAT Informing Materials
 Re: Access to multiple treatment medications.

% who initially request service (and who are screened to need service), who have:	
 A 1st offered appt at OTP w/in 3 days of request 	At least 98%
- Their 1 st intake service at an OTP w/in 3 days of request	At least 95%
% who completed their initial intake/assessment visit and initiate a second treatment visit or day within 14 days	At least 88%
% who initiated a 2 nd visit within 14 days of their initial visit and engage in 2+ treatment visits or days within the next 30 days	At least 75%
% of clients who receive an ASAM LOC assessment at least every 30 days throughout the episode of treatment	100%

<u>Outpatient (OS), Intensive Outpatient (IOS), Recovery Support (RSS)</u> <u>Services</u>

Clients have/eligible for AC Medi-Cal, Indigent or No Other Payor
 If eligible, follow-up to ensure Medi-Cal App submitted within 2 wks of intake

 A 1st offered appt at OS, IOS, or Residential Treatment w/in 10 days of initial request for svcs 	At least 80%
- A 1 st intake service w/in 10 days of initial request for svcs	At least 85%
% who completed their initial intake/assessment visit and initiate a second treatment visit or day w/in 14 days	At least 88%
% who initiated a 2 nd visit w/in 14 days of their initial visit and engage in 2+ treatment visits or days w/in the next 30 days	At least 75%
% who receive an ASAM LOC assessment at least every 30 days throughout the episode of treatment	100%



- Residential Treatment -

Referral documentation from Portals via Sharefile
 Should not be requested from Portals prior to scheduling intake appt
 Each program should specify intake hours and phone number

Clients have/eligible for AC Medi-Cal, Indigent or No Other Payor
 If eligible, follow-up to ensure Medi-Cal App submitted within 1 wk of intake

Reminder: Cannot deny admission based on valid MAT prescription

Length of authorization will vary based on clinical need

Pending Services List and Interim Services

Need for residential providers versus portals to play lead role here for FY 20-21



- Residential Treatment -

Option for providers to conduct 3.2, 3.3, and MAT

- This 'add-on' information will be included in the Exhibit A-SOW if applicable
- Providers should indicate interest on their Provider Input Form
- With appropriate ASAM Designation

May be option for providers to conduct recovery support services
 This will be included in the Exhibit A-P (program area requirements)
 Pending fiscal/funding analysis as priority is bed days

Process Measures	Objectives
% with open episodes who received 1+ service in past 30 days.	100%
% with open episodes who have annual updates completed according to required timeframes	100%
% of prorated contracted units of service provided monthly	75-100%
% of business days (since initiation of bed tracking application) in which Contractor updates the bed tracking application at least once per day	100%
% of intake appointments that were scheduled via three-way call between client, referring portal and Contractor	At least 75%



- Residential Treatment -

Quality Measures	Objectives
% screened as eligible for SUD residential who have:	
- 1st offered appt w/in 10 days of initial request for svcs	At least 80%
- 1st intake service w/in 10 days of initial request for svcs	At least 65%
% who stay for at least 10 days after first intake service	At least 95%
% receiving an ASAM LOC assessment at least every 30 days throughout the residential treatment episode	100%
% of discharged clients that have a follow up session in a lower level of care:	
- Within 7 days after discharge	At least 75%
- within 30 days after discharge	At least 90%



- Recovery Residence -

Referral documentation from Portals via Sharefile

- Should not be requested from Portals prior to scheduling intake appt
- Each program should specify intake hours and phone number

Tracking client's remaining days for Recovery Residence

Providers monitor through Recovery Residence Length of Stay Daily Report

Requesting LOS extensions from ACBH

Through ACBH Form, at least 10 business days prior to expiration of client LOS

- Recovery Residence -

Quality Measures	Objectives
% who receive at least one OS/IOS/RSS service/week while residing in recovery residence	At least 95%
% of prorated contracted units of service provided monthly	80%-100%



- Recovery Residence -

Impact Measures	Objectives
% who discharged with successful program completion	At least 40%
% who are no longer "homeless" at time of discharge	At least 95%



- Primary Prevention -

- New Adolescent Programs
 - Based on recent RFP and specific provider bids
 - Linkage to 2019-2024 Strategic Plan

Continuing Older Adult Programs

- Linkage to 2019-2024 Strategic Plan
- Continuing Adolescent Programs
 - Pending RFP



- Primary Prevention -

Impact Objectives from New Strategic Plan

By 2024, Adolescent substance use will be impacted as follows:

- MS students reporting past 30-day alcohol use will decrease by 3%
- Youth perception that underage drinking is harmful will increase by 3%
- Retail availability of alcohol to minors will decrease by 5%
- Availability of cannabis to minors will decrease by 3%
- By 2024, Older Adults will decrease:
 - Binge alcohol use by 3%
 - Cannabis use in combination with prescription and/or other drugs by 3%
 - Prescription drug use in combination with alcohol and/or other drugs by 3%
