Side Effects and Management		
Common (greater than 10 in 100 clients on this medication)		
Dry mouth	Suck on sugarless gum or candy or melt bits of ice in your mouth. Call your prescriber if your mouth feels dry for more than 2 weeks.	
Blurred Vision	Caution when operating a vehicle or machinery.	
Excessive daytime Sleepiness	May want to take the medication earlier than at bedtime. Caution when operating vehicles or machinery.	
Dizziness	Get up slowly, and dangle your feet when rising from a chair. Caution when climbing stairs or changing position. Talk to your prescriber.	
Uncommon (~1 to 10 in 100 clients on this medication)		
Constipation	Drink plenty of water and increase fiber and fruits in your diet. Consult your prescriber about other treatments.	
Nausea	Take with food. Consult your prescriber if it becomes bothersome.	
Nervousness	Typically short-term (1-5 days) as system adjusts to medicine. Contact prescriber if persistent.	
Changes in sexual	Men: delayed ejaculation, inability to achieve orgasm.	
functioning	Women: decreased interest, inability to achieve orgasm. Reversible, therefore consult with your prescriber.
