

Request for Qualifications:

Criminal Justice Inpatient Services (CJIS) Program

Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services (BHCS) is publishing this Request for Qualifications to identify a provider to deliver an acute psychiatric inpatient jail-based program to be located at the North County jail (GDDF). It is expected that BHCS will require approximately ten full-time beds within a facility that could accommodate approximately 20 beds. The other ten beds would be leased to surrounding counties at a rate to be determined during contract negotiations.

BHCS is using this RFQ process to identify a partner who will work with BHCS to provide this program. During a two-month planning process beginning in February and ending in April, 2008, BHCS and the grantee will clarify logistical, programmatic and fiscal issues to be incorporated into a 28-month contract for operating the program that would begin mid-April, 2008. As part of these negotiations BHCS and the selected provider-partner will identify the optimum inmate population that would meet programmatic, staffing, and fiscal requirements. Funding in the amount of \$10,000 will be provided to the grantee for collaborating with BHCS during the two-month planning process.

As part of the planning, BHCS and the successful Respondent will outline a finance, facility, staffing, and treatment plan. The goal of the plan is to provide the highest quality treatment program while containing BHCS costs.

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
