

CANS/ANSA 101: TCOM Orientation and CANS/ANSA Overview

DESCRIPTION:

This one-day General Training provides an overview of the ACBHS CANS 0-5, CANS 6-17, ANSA-T and ANSA 25+ versions and Transformational Collaborative Outcomes Management (TCOM). TCOM's overall framework, key concepts and how its multilevel approach directly benefits children and families will be discussed. The principles and best practices in using the CANS/ANSA as TCOM's assessment strategy, a communication framework, and tools to monitor outcomes and inform care plans will also be addressed.

Using mock vignettes and small group activities, this 6-hour, interactive session will prepare users for certification and use of the TCOM tools.
