

 Use Services for the Department.



SERVICE DELIVERY:

Substance Use Treatment

Continuum of Care with Gender and Age-Specific Programs



- SOBERING CENTER & SOCIAL MODEL DETOX: RECEIVES
 CLIENTS FOR LESS THAN 24 HOURS OF SAFE SOBERING.
- RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT: 20+ HOURS OF PROGRAMMING PER WEEK.
- RECOVERY RESIDENCE (SOBER LIVING ENVIRONMENTS): TEMPORARY HOUSING IN COMBINATION WITH OUTPATIENT TREATMENT.
- INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT TREATMENT: MORE THAN 9 HOURS PER WEEK.
- NARCOTIC TREATMENT PROGRAMS: PROVIDES
 METHADONE AND INDIVIDUAL DRUG COUNSELING.
- TREATMENT: INTEGRATED IN PRIMARY CARE TEAMS ACROSS FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTERS (FQHCS).



CONTEXT

According to the National Center for Health Statistics -

African Americans are disproportionally affected by:

- Poor Health Outcomes
- Higher Incarceration Rates
- Higher Mortality Rates
 - Leading Causes of Death: Heart Disease, Cancer, Accidents
- Higher Infant Death Rates
- Income & Education Disparities
- Unemployment, under-employed, uninsured, or under-insured


According to the United States Census Bureau (2019) -

- Alameda County Population Estimates (July 1, 2019): 1,671,329
- Education:
 - High School Graduate or Higher, persons age 25+ years (2014-2018): 88.0%
 - Bachelor's Degree or higher, persons age 25+ years (2014-2018): 46%
- Black or African American estimates, by percent: 11%
- Poverty Rate: 9%
- Households with a broadband Internet subscription (between 2014-2018): 87.5%




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

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
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Is there a local crisis in wellness?

Figure 1. Age-adjusted suicide rates for females, by race and ethnicity: United States, 1999 and 2017





Figure 2. Age-adjusted suicide rates for males, by race and ethnicity: United States, 1999 and 2017




CONTEXT — Local Statistics

Suicide Rates in Alameda County -

Overall Statistics:

- There were 744 individuals that committed suicide in alameda county between 2015 to 2019.
- For every 100,000 members of the community, 8.5 individuals may commit suicide
- Older adults, especially those 85 years or more, are at a greater risk for suicide than younger people. This is especially true amongst males.



Trends and Cultural considerations:


- Male-identified persons complete suicide at over three times the rate of females.
- Amongst African American individuals, the suicide rate is 8.1 per 100,000; as compared to a suicide rate of 13.1 per 100,000 individuals for persons who identified as White (non-Hispanic).

What can you do?

Addressing Mental Behavioral Health Care & Wellness within the African American & Black Community



- 1) Ask & Listen: And don't be afraid to ask direct questions. Stigma and secrecy can be deadly.
- 2) Seek Professional Help and resources: Unless you are an expert or an emergency care professional, seek and get assistance as soon as you have <u>any</u> concern that there might be an urgent issue.
- 3) Remember mental health recovery is a journey: Healing takes time and commitment.



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
