Effective Friday, November 11, 2022, our fellow executive leader, Mr. Imo Momoh, Deputy Director, Plan Administrator will be leaving his position with Alameda County. On behalf of our entire Executive Team, we are extremely honored to have worked alongside such an exemplary leader during his tenure.

As the inaugural Plan Administrator for this department, Imo provided leadership on critical programs and operations. He joined our system at the start of the Pandemic, and galvanized many strategic changes to support our department and our community. Some of the highlights of his work and partnership with various ACBH staff and stakeholders include: the procurement and launch of our Practice Management System project, *SmartCare*; the development of the DHCS-approved Behavioral Health Quality Improvement Program (BHQIP) Implementation Plan in preparation for CalAIM; the development of our department's first executive work plan and the ACBH Plan Administration Work Plan; and the launch of the ACBH Budget Teams for enhanced financial stewardship. Under Imo's leadership, our department also experienced the successful implementation of the Contracts Lifecycle Management (CLM) System; the creation and launch of the department's first Data Governance Committee; and efforts to consistently improve service quality and performance as detailed in various State audits. His partnership and focus with his team helped to locally operationalize state policy changes and also provide tools for staff to work remotely these past few years, including working along our finance leaders to increase community based organization contract allocations at a favorable rate. These represent just some of the highlights among many other activities we have been able to accomplish together with Deputy Director Momoh's support and leadership.

I am proud of his service and thank him now and going forward. It goes without saying that always onward and upward, Imo will be transitioning to the Behavioral Health Division of the San Francisco Department of Public Health as the **Director of Managed Care**. We are pleased to be in a position to support him as he moves ahead, and are thankful to have another great partner working in the Bay Area.
