## Applying Updated Information from the DSM-5-TR in work with Children, Adolescents, and Transition Aged Youth

**Description:** When working with clients in the fields of Mental Health and Social Services, it's important to understand the DSM and the criteria it provides for each diagnosis. The DSM-5-TR (text revision) was recently updated and now includes changes in criteria to diagnoses and new diagnoses. Learn about the DSM, new and updated diagnoses, and how these changes may impact the diagnoses most commonly used with children and teens. Also learn how the DSM addresses cultural considerations in diagnosing. Information will be taught through lecture, video and case vignettes.

**Trainer:** Rachel Michaelsen, LCSW, is a clinical social worker who has worked in HMOs, public agencies, and private practice as both a mental-health provider and a supervisor for over thirty years. She was a collaborating clinician investigator on the DSM-5 field trials. She has taught courses in: DSM-5, clinical supervision, law & ethics, childhood psychopathology, time management, vicarious trauma, and energy psychology for various universities, conferences, and mental-health agencies.

**Learning Objectives – at the end of the training, participants will be able to:**

1. Define a mental health disorder according to the DSM-5 TR
2. Differentiate between a culturally bound syndrome and a DSM diagnosis
3. Explain the difference between a subtype and a specifier
4. List the three new diagnoses in the DSM-5-TR
5. Identify at least 5 diagnoses that have been updated in DSM-5-TR
6. Identify three changes in the DSM-5-TR that impact the diagnoses of children, teens, and TAY with whom they work.
