## Course Objectives

1.) Participants will analyze at least 2 ways in which speaking to clients in their native language promotes collaboration and allyship.

2.) Participants will explore 1-2 culturally responsive interventions to be applied to case plans.

3.) Participants will identify 2-4 best practices in Case Planning while providing services in Spanish.

4.) Participants will practice applying 1-2 case materials to case planning in Spanish.



**\*TRAINING WILL BE PRESENTED IN SPANISH**\* Collaboration is highly valued in the service delivery field. It is highly important to collaborate with other professionals when providing services to family, but it is even more beneficial for families that we treat them as partners throughout this process and remain collaborative with them. Sometimes, in bilingual service delivery, families lose their voice and ability to advocate due to language barriers and bias; therefore, it is imperative that we work towards engaging in effective practices to maintain this partnership and empower the families we serve. In this workshop, participants will review effective case planning in bilingual service delivery. Participants will practice how to engage Spanish Speaking clients and families in their native language to increase the partnership with the family as the services that culturally responsive.
