We strive to deliver services in partnership with our clients, from a strength-based approach, to support them as they move along their path of wellness and resiliency.



Forensic Services



ACBHD operates a variety of services that have a focus on Medi-Cal beneficiaries who have had interactions with law enforcement. Our department has developed a Forensic, Diversion and Re-Entry Services system of care to support individuals and their families as they navigate this time in their lives; in partnership with many community-based organizations, health care facilities, and other County agencies.

ACBHD operates both behavioral health programs in the juvenile and adult detention centers as well as a large network of community-based programs such as a Behavioral Health Court (BHC), Assisted Outpatient Treatment programs, and forensic involved Full-Service Partnerships.


Substance Use
