Asian American communities have long been excluded in conversations of racial equity and social justice. However, the rise of anti-Asian hate during and since the COVID-19 pandemic has shown that our community needs greater care, safety, and cultural understanding. As clinicians and organizations that serve Asian Americans, we must adopt anti-racist frameworks for how we approach client care, and for how we foster our organizational environments and cultures. This workshop will explore ways that service providers and organizations can actively examine our interpersonal practice, ensure our organizations and institutions are accountable to the communities we serve, and actively strive to decolonize the systems of care to ensure optimal health outcomes for Asian American clients.
