Course Description:

This training module will provide participants with foundational knowledge of health equity issues facing Latinx individuals and communities, specifically in behavioral health settings. Using the principles of Cultural Humility and Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services (CLAS), participants will examine how systems of care can reduce health disparities and improve service delivery for Latinx individuals. The session will explore the intersections of race, ethnicity, and behavioral health, with a focus on language access, cultural competence, and creating equitable environments for Latinx communities.
