# **CLAS Standards & Stigma/Discrimination Reduction in Behavioral Health**

#### **Course Description:**

This training will explore the impacts of mental illness and racial identity stigma on accessing mental health care. It highlights that over half of individuals with mental illness do not seek treatment due to fear of being treated differently, which is exacerbated for those from racial and ethnic groups facing "double stigma." We will also discuss barriers behavioral health providers encounter when addressing these issues and provide strategies for countering stigma, prejudice, and discrimination against people with mental illness.
