In 1999, she was employed as a Housing Coordinator for Alameda County Lead Poisoning Prevention. She coordinated and provided education and resources for healthy living conditions. In 2005, Kara took a position as a Business Office Manager (BOM) at Telecare/Gladman Mental Health Rehabilitation Center and then promoted to Regional Manager in 2010. During this time, Kara obtained her master's in business communication from Brandman University, Irvine. Programs under her leadership included: Sausal Creek Crisis Center, Heritage PHF, Gladman MHRC, Redwood Place, and Willow Rock PHF in San Leandro.

The Last nine years of Kara's career were spent at Alameda County Social Services Public Guardian Office where she was an LPS (Lanterman Petris-Short) Deputy Public Guardian Conservatorship and in 2019, promoted to Adult Protection Supervisor. Kara's supervised a Unit of 6 Deputy Public Guardian-Conservator Investigators and supported them in the planning, management, and resolution of mental health issues/crisis of caseloads with 70 per staff.
