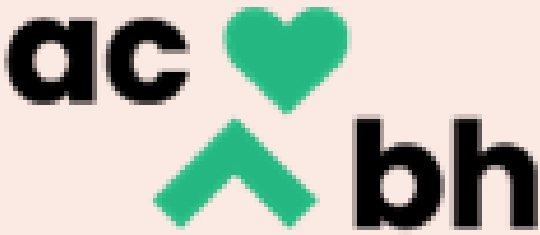


Rosa Warder
