The course equips attendees with culturally responsive strategies to address these inequities, emphasizing the implementation of the National CLAS (Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services) Standards. By focusing on mitigating implicit bias and fostering cultural humility, this training aims to enhance the quality and effectiveness of behavioral health services for African American communities.
