Course Description:

Building on the November 2024 "Introduction to CLAS" workshop, this interactive session explores the interconnection between CLAS Standards, social determinants of health, and protective/risk factors for behavioral health wellness.

This training will explore how the CLAS Standards address cultural and linguistic barriers to care, how social determinants shape individual conditions, and how understanding risk/protective factors empowers providers and individuals to reduce risks and improve protection. Participants will analyze real-world situations to develop effective strategies for addressing community needs and promoting wellness.


