## **Purpose of the Meeting**

The Advisory Council are subject matter experts within the County of Alameda who hold specialized knowledge on **substance use disorders** and/or county processes and/or fiscal expertise and/or deep understanding of the opioid crisis as a public health emergency. The Council will meet 2 to 3 times a year to provide ongoing feedback to Alameda County Behavioral Health Department (ACBHD) on the planning, spending, and long-term strategies regarding Opioid Settlement dollars. The Council will not be a decision-making body but will provide expert content, advice and guidance to ACBHD to guide the department in the various needs of the settlement dollars.

## **Opioid Settlement Funds: Fiscal Update (May 2025)**

- Total Settlement Funds: Up to \$80M\*
- Total Received to Date: \$24.3M
  - Abatement Allocation: \$18.7M
  - Reallocated from Cities: \$1.1M
     (Alameda, Albany, Hayward, Livermore, Newark, Piedmont, Pleasanton)
  - Subdivision Allocation (legal fees): \$4.5M
- Expended to date: \$9.2M
