Participants will learn where each degree of smoke comes from, what they each mean, and the depths of their infiltration into the air and/or various surfaces. Additionally, by the end of the training each participant will be able to explain how 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree smoke each impact children and their health in dangerous ways.

Who Should Attend: This training is designed for administrative and/or clinical staff of Alameda County Public Health Department-contracted provider organizations and Alameda County Behavioral Health-contracted substance use treatment and mental health programs, but all are welcome to attend.
