

Youth Tobacco Treatment: Considerations for Providers

Description: Tobacco use treatment with youth needs to be provided with careful considerations. This 1-hour training will provide providers with a path to help youth recover from tobacco use. Participants will learn how to address tobacco use with youth, effective treatment strategies that are helpful to them, and the use of nicotine replacement therapy in the treatment of youth. How to make appropriate referrals for youth for further treatment and communication with parents will also be addressed.

Who Should Attend: This training is designed for administrative and/or clinical staff of Alameda County Public Health Department-contracted provider organizations and Alameda County Behavioral Health-contracted substance use treatment and mental health programs, but all are welcome to attend.
