Audience: Mental health professionals or anyone in a position to work with <u>children adolescents</u>, and <u>transition-aged youth (TAY)</u> who may be experiencing a suicidal crisis. This training is reserved for Alameda County Behavioral Health, *contracted* Provider Staff *and contracted* CBOs.

Description: The training addresses common myths and perceptions about suicidal behavior. The workshop will also cover suicide statistics, trauma, and suicide theory with an emphasis on Thomas Joiner's model. Risk factors, warning signs, and protective factors will be introduced for <u>youth populations</u>. Participants will learn methods of suicide risk assessment and will be introduced to screening tools that aid in determining risk. Methods for how to talk about and ask about suicide with a client will also be addressed. A combination of teaching methods, including didactic work, lecture, and discussion will be used.

Trainer: Cris Rita, MA, is the Community Education Coordinator & Lead Instructor at Crisis Support Services of Alameda County (CSS). She provides suicide and related mental health education to all members of the Alameda County community. Positions held include: 24-Hr Crisis Line Volunteer Trainer, 24-Hr Crisis Line Overnight Supervisor, 24-Hr Crisis Line Shift Supervisor, Teens for Life Health Educator.

Learning Objectives – by the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate competence in speaking about suicidal thoughts, behaviors and feelings to potentially suicidal children/adolescents by asking 5 basic questions to determine suicidality.
- **2.** Identify 2 suicide risk factors behavior that may differ in diverse communities by reviewing current research and statistics.
- 3. Identify 5 risk factors in identifying suicide risk in children and adolescents.
- **4.** Identify the 5 most common warning signs for children and adolescents.
- 5. Identify 3 protective factors for both children and adolescents.
- **6.** Identify the 4 domains of suicide risk assessment.
- 7. Review 3 assessment screening tools.
- **8.** Demonstrate competence in using lethal means counseling with client and family or caregivers through 4 collaborative steps.
- 9. Reduce suicide risk by listing the 6 steps to develop a Safety Plan.
- **10.** Help clinicians learn how to support others and themselves if they lose a client to suicide in 4 supportive ways.
