#### About the Course:

This training is being provided to improve harm reduction and provide education surrounding opioid abuse & overdose by focusing on the use of NARCAN as an emergency medication. With so many staff members working within the community this provides them with the knowledge to respond in an emergency to an opioid overdose by “recognizing signs of an opioid overdose” (National Harm Reduction Coalition, 2020), understanding the dangers of opioids substances utilizing “One Pill Can Kill” (Drug Enforcement Administration, n.d.), and accessing resources such as free Narcan, e.g. “Narcan Vending Machines.

#### About the Presenter:

Hi, I'm Tiffanie. I am a Registered Nurse with a bachelor's degree in nursing and hold the position of Community Based Services Nurse Manager as well as provide direct nursing support to a variety of Seneca programs. With so many of our team members working within the community this is an added tool to support community safety and potentially save a life.

#### Educational Goals:

The goal of this training is to give those who work in the community the knowledge to provide emergency care utilizing Narcan in an emergency where possible opioid overdose has occurred. The attendee will be equipped with knowledge of what Narcan is and how it works, how to administer, how to assess for possible overdose, and understand necessary monitoring after medication administration to support people who may be experiencing opioid overdose.

#### Measurable Learning Objectives:

- Identify 3 drugs that are classified as opioids and their subtypes.
- Identify 4 symptoms of opioid overdose.
- Identify 4 symptoms of opioid withdrawal.
- Identify the 5 steps for administering Narcan.
- Identify 3 methods of harm reduction.

#### Continuing Education Credits
