

ACBHD SUD Scope of Practice Reference Guide

All Medi-Cal services must be under the direction of a licensed LPHA. Registered, waived, and non-licensed staff must meet all supervision requirements per their credentialing entity. Staff must work within their scope of practice, training, and ability.

Students/Clinical Trainees ⁹	Clinical Trainees: Clinical trainees for any of the above designations are allowed when the individual is actively enrolled in a corresponding post-secondary educational program. Generally, scope of practice standards for clinical trainees are equivalent to the credential/license they are pursuing (e.g., a MSW student can perform similar functions as an ASW/LCSW). All clinical trainees must be supervised by licensed (not registered/waivered) practitioners. See applicable licensing board for additional oversight and supervision requirements (e.g., CA BBS , CA Board of Psychology , CA, CA Board of Nursing). All clinical documentation completed by clinical trainees requires licensed LPHA co-signature. First year mental health graduate students DO NOT have the scope of practice to diagnose and may not establish a MH or SUD diagnosis, even with a co-signature.

Licensed physician co-signature recommended.	• Licensed Counselor • Certified Counselor • Registered Counselor SUD Counselors may only have credentials from DHCS approved SUD counselor certifying organizations . LPHA co-signature recommended.	•Certified Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialist (CMPSS) •Certified Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialist Family (CMPSS-F) A CMPSS is an individual with a current State-approved Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialist Certification Program certification and must meet ongoing education requirements. CMPSS provides services under the direction of a Behavioral Health Professional. Must have completed DHCS/ACBH approved peer certification. May only use codes H0025 and H0038.
