SUBJECT: CBOs Have Purchasing Power

The CBOs Have Purchasing Power Program was initiated in November 2005 to encourage County contracted community-based organizations (CBOs) to benefit from surplused County property at the County's Property & Salvage warehouse on the Fairmont Campus in San Leandro. The County's CBOs have 501c3 tax status and are nonprofit organizations.

Any CBO with a contract with an Alameda County Department can participate in this Program. The Program allows contracted CBOs to have surplused property at no cost. Under the direction of the P&S staff, the CBOs are responsible for removing and transporting appropriate surplused property. It is the sole discretion of P&S management to determine if P&S articles at the warehouse are appropriate for the CBOs.

Any CBO without a County contract, or any resident, can visit P&S during P&S business hours and pay "pennies on the dollar" for surplused property. The cost and availability of these items is determined by P&S management.

How does a CBO get a contract with the County? On the occasion that the General Services Agency (GSA), on behalf of a County Department, releases an RFP (request for proposal) to purchase a community service, any qualified CBO can respond to the RFP.
