SUBJECT: Payment Reform and Training for CPT Code Billing

This memorandum is to make providers aware of helpful resources, including recorded training programs, related to CalAIM Payment Reform transition to CPT code billing.

Background

Beginning July 1, 2023, the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) Payment Reform initiative will change the way county behavioral health plans claim federal reimbursement. The initiative consists of three different transitions: Reimbursement Structure, Financing Mechanism and Provider Billing.

Changes related to Provider Billing involve transitioning from the use of Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPC) codes to Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) Codes. **Note:** HCPC codes will continue to be used for non-clinical services and services provided by non-licensed staff.

Available Resources

ACBH Billing and Benefits and Contracts teams have been working diligently to prepare for changes resulting from CalAIM Payment Reform. California Mental Health Services Authority (CAIMHSA), on behalf of the counties, has assumed scopes of work to support the statewide implementation of CalAIM behavioral health initiatives, including developing training and resource documents.

Below are several helpful resources, developed by CalMHSA and others, that can be utilized to better understand and prepare for these changes:

Additionally, they include other critical information such as allowable disciplines, modifiers and Add-on codes, place of





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service, lockouts, etc. on the "CalAIM Manual Extract" tab. The Guides can be accessed on the <u>CalMHSA</u> <u>CalAIM Reference and Manuals</u> website.

CalAIM Payment Reform Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) Document:

The ACBH Finance Division issued a <u>CalAIM Payment Reform FAQ</u> that contains responses to frequently asked questions from ACBH providers related to changes to reimbursement structure.

ACBH will be developing other tools and resources to support providers with this transition and will provide communication as they become available.
