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NTP/OTP JULY 1, 2018 IMPLEMENTATION

- 1. Progress Notes and Claiming are Procedure Code (PC) specific.
 - a. Each note will include:
 - i. the New Procedure Codes and Procedure Names (see attached PC Lists and Service Descriptions);
 - ii. the Location (NTP Clinic);
 - iii. the language the service was provided in and who provided the language or interpretation;
 - iv. the staff providing the service;
 - v. the service start, end and duration time;
 - vi. the documentation date, start, end and total time:
 - 1. Documentation time includes the time taken to write up the templates (Assessment, Plan, etc.) and/or Progress Notes;
 - vii. the total time to be claimed in InSyst.
 - b. A separate progress note will be written for each unique Procedure claimed in InSyst. For example, each of these procedures provided on the same day would require a separate PN and separate claim line: Individual Counseling, Collateral and Medication Service. As well, if a service has distinct start and end times, then a separate PN and claim is required. The above example may be individual Counseling was provided 9am – 9:25 am, a Collateral phone call was provided from 2 – 2:10 and medication dosing was provided 9:40 – 9:50.
- 2. The claiming process in InSyst remains the same except there are now additional Procedure Codes.
- 3. Until the EHR is updated to include the new Procedure Codes and all of the above items, all of this information must be located in the body of the PN.
- 4. All New PN requirements and claiming are effective 7/1/18 (InSyst will no longer accept the old codes).
- 5. The ASAM must be completed at the time of the Intake SUD Intake/Assessment for all new clients (see attached ASAM document) and at the due date of every Plan update.
 - a. All existing clients must have must have an ASAM completed by July 31, and by the due date of every Plan update.
 - b. ASAM administration are claimed as an Assessment activity.
- 6. At this time there are no regulatory or documentation requirement changes to NTP services other than those indicated above.
