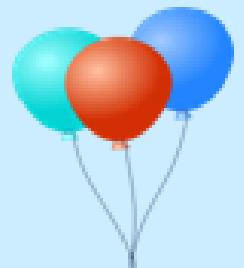

Jay Mahler Recovery Center

This crisis residential facility is a result of a collaboration between Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services (ACBHCS) and Telecare Corporation, one of the nation's largest family and employee owned providers of adult mental health services. Since 1965, Telecare's mission has been to deliver and manage excellent services and systems of care for people with serious mental health issues. Telecare is proud to celebrate 50 years of providing respect, recovery and results.

After three years of planning, this 8,000 sq. ft., state of the art facility will serve up to 16 adults between the ages of 18-64 in an exquisite homelike environment. The overarching goal of this voluntary program is to provide an alternative to hospitalization and to help people "get back on their feet" in approximately a 30-day or less timeframe. All services will be provided day and evening, 7 days a week. ACBHCS's philosophy is that consumers are best serviced within a recovery-oriented environment of healing peer and staff support, that promotes recovery and wellness using a holistic approach. During their stay, consumers will receive one-on-one counseling, group therapy, wellness and recovery action plan assistance and community outings. For those who prefer more solitude and peaceful reflection, we have added a quiet room for rest and relaxation. Staffing will include a medical director, rehabilitation therapist, social worker, licensed vocational nurses, residential counselors, and peer staff.
